After meeting early in the morning of Friday, May 24 and heading south, we boarded trams to tour the Toyota plant in Georgetown, KY. A short drive took us to Old Friends/Dream Chase Farm where race horses get to retire to a quiet life and be fed carrot treats by visitors. Lunch was at Red State BBQ before we drove to our hotel for the weekend, the Holiday Inn Express in Versailles. Dinner was at the Claudia Sanders (yes, Mrs. Colonel) Dinner House in Shelbyville, followed by a delightful drive east on US 60 through Frankfort to our hotel.

Saturday started with a morning tour of Keeneland led by MINI passenger Libby Welker a veteran of the thoroughbred horse industry. We got a special treat when one of the Outriders (Colby riding "Mouse") came over to talk with us at Libby's request. Our next stop was Wild Turkey Distillery for a tour and tasting. We heard banjos as we transited to lunch at The Glitz in the lower level of Irish Acres Antiques, a decommissioned school FILLED with antiques and sparkly things. Gary Miller got a special birthday serenade from another group dining there. After lunch, our route started with some twisties, then settled into a nice drive passing Shaker Village on US 68 to Limestone Branch Distillery, a MUCH smaller operation than Wild Turkey! Our day ended with supper at the historic Old Talbot Tavern in Bardstown.

Sunday's animals were bison at the Blackfish Bison Ranch east of Lexington, south of Winchester. After a one-hour presentation. Brandon Hampton, the ranch owner, loaded <u>us</u> into a wagon and towed <u>us</u> into the paddock where the animals were grazing but came to our trailer to enjoy the apple and oat horse treats! After following part of the Clark County Stone Fence Tour, we stopped at a series of murals at the original site of Fort Boonesboro on the Kentucky River. Lunch was at Hall's on the River on the Beer Cheese Trail, then a photo at the stone fence entrance to the Lower Howard's Creek Nature Preserve. We returned to the hotel for a quiet afternoon before the monsoon came through. We caught a break to get to supper at the Versailles Brewing Company just across US 60 from our hotel.

Monday was a free-for-all. After a leisurely breakfast at the hotel, some headed home, some went to the Kentucky Horst Park, others headed to the Kentucky Artisan Center in Berea, either by country roads or I-75.

Location: Live Oak Vocational School - 5956 Buckwheat Road - Milford, OH 45150-2287. Exit # 57 from 1-275 and go northeast on Route 28. (towards Blanchester) use the bypass - Right on Buckwheat Road (@Circle K gas station) this is the nearest rest room and store.

Time: The main gate opens before 9:00 AM. Registration is the first 20 cars with up to 25 drivers. Preference may be given to Ohio Valley AHC members. The maximum is usually reached BEFORE 10:00 AM. Runs start as soon as possible. Clean up and awards about 3:30. The more help picking up cones and cleaning the earlier we leave.

Cost: \$25.00 per Driver - Max - 25 drivers - spectators free! - Rain or Shine

Everyone will be required to sign a waiver and all drivers are required to work the course when not driving. Bring chairs and a cooler; there is shade available. No alcohol.

Required Equipment: A safe/functioning car (we will inspect it) any make or model, the cooler the better; Helmets are required for drivers and passengers. There are usually loaners available.

Goal: "Fun & Family Oriented Gymkhana" Meaning - street legal tires driven to the event only (no tire changing is allowed); No trailered cars unless they are vintage European or Japanese. We may give out awards for improvement over the day i.e., training.

This event is designed to be a safe, fun way to enjoy your automobile. No dangerous driving or recklessness will be tolerated. We operate near a residential section and ask that the exhaust system be street legal for noise. Regardless; we reserve the right to determine if it toooo loud. We want to come back next year.

We would like to see more vintage iron in 2015.... Remember - you are competing against yourself, not others - come out and have some fun with your car!






