Fall Spirited Drive

On Saturday, October 15, we had one of the largest turnouts for our Fall Spirited Drive, ever!! We had a total of 26 cars - 17 Minis and 9 Miata's! We met in the New Riff Distillery/The Party Source parking lot and left via I-471 but exited on Grand Avenue so that we could drive through the hills and hollers of Northern KY to Red State BBQ in Lexington. We pretty much managed to keep the group together which is surprising with such a large number of cars. About an hour into the drive we had a pitstop in Falmouth KY. From there we headed west on KY-330 for a spirited drive through the rolling hills of central Kentucky to



the horse country of Lexington. After navigating some of the major highways west of Lexington we finally ended up at Red State BBQ for some of the best BBQ in Kentucky.



After lunch and a short drivers' about a half dozen cars headed to Castle & Key Distillery on the south side of Frankfort. C&K is located in the Old Taylor Distillery Company along Glenns Creek, a tributary of the Kentucky River, which also flows past Buffalo Trace Distillery. Kentucky's great limestone filtered water is what makes KY Bourbon unique among bourbons. We all enjoyed wandering their beautiful grounds, checking out the Spring House, where it was shady, and tasting their wares before heading home to Greater Cincinnati.











We did have a few learnings from the drive. At every driver's meeting we say "each car is responsible for keeping the car behind in sight". Right at the start 2 cars, without navigators, headed north on I-471 instead of south. They managed to plot a different route and met us in Falmouth. After leaving

Falmouth we had a car miss a "Left, Straight, Right" sequence of turns and in spite of the horn beeping and radio calls from the sweeper and missing the sight of the immediate-leading car who had stopped on KY-330, a little past the intersection – this resulted in a "lost" car, and all three of the last cars made errors.

Typically we hear too many cars say "We'll just follow the car in front", but when the string is interrupted, EVERY CAR MAY AT SOME POINT BECOME THE LEADER of a shortened group. We need to stress that all navigators follow along with the directions, and we especially need everyone without a navigator to listen to the upcoming turn directions on the family radio channel. We also need to point out the importance of having a FRS (Family Radio Service) radio. Most of us in QCC have a Motorola FRS radio. There are other brands out there but some are not



compatible with the Motorola radios. (We do have instructions for making Midland radios work with the Motorola's however it is a complicated procedure.) These radios can be purchased at Dick's Sporting Goods, Bass Pro Shops, Target, and Amazon, to name a few and are usually less than \$100 for a pair. Those without radios at the start must borrow one from the club's extra supply or from another participant, with instructions for use.

All in all, we had a beautiful day for an awesome drive through the amazing Kentucky countryside. There is nothing better than being with our fellow MINIacs for a great drive! Thanks to all who came out and enjoyed the fun!

1. Snow Tires

These types of wheels will make it easier for your <u>Mini Cooper</u> to grip the road, even if it's covered in ice, snow, or slush. Snow tires were created to improve traction, which also greatly improves your chances of driving safely when it's snowing.

2. Brake Inspection

We can all agree that brakes are an essential auto system any time of the year. <u>Mini Coopers</u> have some amazing and modern brake safety features, like anti-lock brakes and automatic stability control. We recommend scheduling a brake inspection to ensure your brakes are working at top-notch performance. Plus, if they're not up to par, those advanced features will not be much help when driving on wet roads.

3. Wipers & Lights

While investing in a good set of snow tires and having the brakes inspected will get your Mini Cooper winter-road ready, checking the windshield wipers, wiper fluid, and taillights will also aid in safe driving for you and others on the road with you. If it's been a while since you've changed your windshield wipers or they're not working as well as they should be, now is a great time to replace them. Also, purchase some windshield washer fluid that contains a de-icer to keep your windshield from icing up. If any of the taillights need to be fixed, again, now is the time to take care of this essential task.
